

This fall Alberta Biodiversity Monitoring Institute (ABMI) is asking people to upload sightings of wild hare to help track seasonal colour change. For hares, the ability to change colour is an important adaptation to protect themselves from predators. They sync their colour with the changing seasons, but a changing climate can sometimes result in them wearing the wrong coat! This can leave them vulnerable to predators, and scientists are interested in the hare's ability to adjust their colour-changing habits with our changing seasons.




OTHER WATERSHED RESOURCES
