# **Project Overview**



#### Purpose

Provide multi-stakeholder advice and perspectives on the continuous improvement of the Alberta Wetland Policy implementation.



### Objectives

- Assess understanding of terminology
- Identify potential performance measures
- Describe challenges, opportunities, and unintended consequences

#### **Team and Operations**

- 22 Team members
- November 2020 to March 2021
- 29 hours over 15 virtual meetings
  - ~435 hours of team time
  - ~350 hours of between meeting time
- MIRO Virtual collaboration platform



#### Sector Engagement Survey

- Open for response from 9 December 2020 to 29 January 2021.
- In total, 58 responses were received from across fifteen groups or organizations

- Complemented by the project engagement survey
- Support continuous improvement of implementation

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# **Project Results**



## Policy Terminology

- All policy statements rated more unclear than clear
- Two statements were rated most unclear
  - Wetlands are managed by avoiding, minimizing, and if necessary, replacing lost wetland value (Outcome #3)
  - Enable flexible wetland management (Strategic Direction #1)

#### **Measuring Performance**

- Five potential performance measures identified
  - Area, number, and class of wetlands with a protective designation
  - Area, number, and class of <u>wetlands lost</u>
  - Area, number, and class of wetlands replaced
  - Wetland replacement funds collected and spent
  - <u>Timelines</u> for regulatory review

## Additional Reporting

- Four additional reporting metrics
  - Wetland Inventory
  - *Review of application requirements*
  - BMP review
  - Inventory of education/ stewardship programming



#### Successes

- An Approved Wetland Policy
  - Enabled wetland management tools and provincial management
- Operational Mitigation and Restoration Programs
  - Facilitated Policy implementation
- Improved Dialogue and Education
  - New dialogue on wetland conservation and restoration

## Challenges

- Implementation Complexity
  - Process and guidance are complex, requiring expert support
- Regulatory Efficiency
  - Process could be more efficient and cost effective
- Assessment Tools
  - Tools are not transparent, are poorly understood, and don't extend beyond ecological aspects of wetland value

## Challenges

- Transparency and Reporting
  - Minimal public reporting diminishes trust in the policy and tools
- Sufficient Educational and Stewardship Support
  - More sector-specific educational support required

#### Opportunities

- Clarify Policy Requirements
  - Clarify so implementation is less reliant on specialized expertise
- Indigenous Dialogue and Perspectives
  - Open meaningful dialogue with Alberta's Indigenous peoples to better involve Indigenous peoples in implementation

#### Opportunities

- Enhanced Educational Programming
  - Expand educational programming to improve accessibility
- Improved Public Reporting
  - Provide a better understanding of implementation progress
