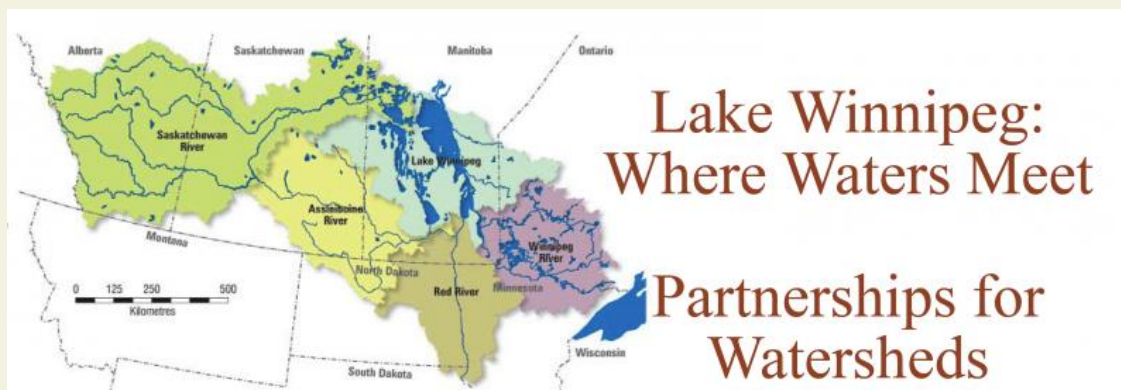


NSWA HEADWATERS TOUR 2019

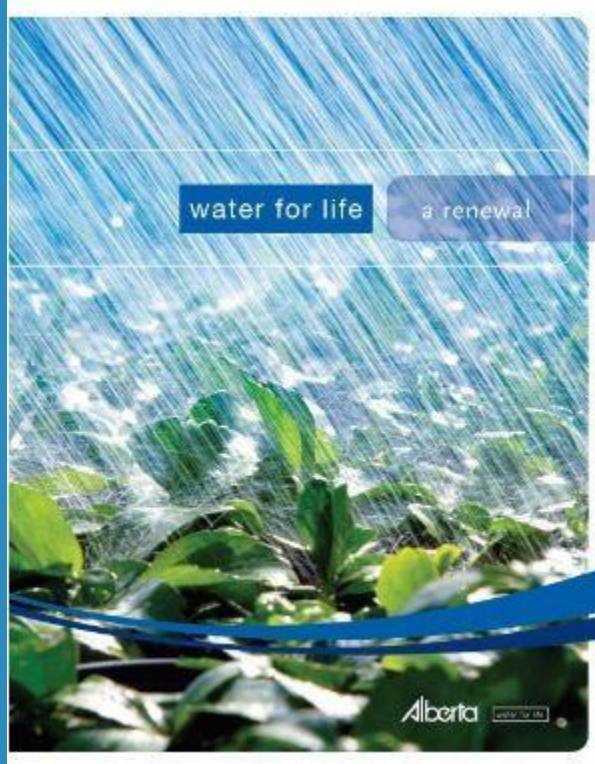


Partners FOR the Saskatchewan River Basin Conference 2019

PFSRB's 2019 conference, "Lake Winnipeg: Where Waters Meet", provides an opportunity to examine the partnerships that are already in place among the various watershed groups across the Prairie Provinces. 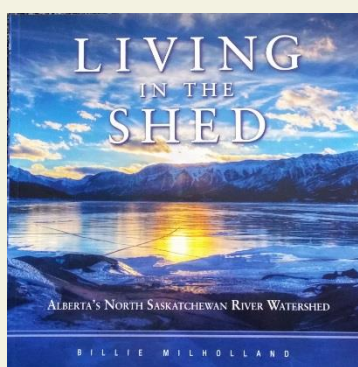


DID YOU KNOW?

The **Water for Life Strategy**, first introduced by the Government of Alberta in 2003, was the first of its kind in North America. It reflects a growing awareness of Albertans for fair and sustainable water management. The NSWA is one of eleven Watershed Planning and Advisory Councils (WPACs) in Alberta that are responsible for moving the Water for Life Strategy forward. We work alongside our partners - Alberta Environment and Parks, Alberta Water Council, watershed stewardship groups and other WPACs to ensure:

- safe, secure drinking water supplies
- healthy aquatic ecosystems
- reliable, quality water supplies for a sustainable economy
